KWUN TONG LINE EXTENSION

**NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING
PERMANENT CLOSURE OF SECTIONS OF TAK TING STREET AND
SHUNG KING STREET; AND TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF
A STAIRCASE OF THE FOOTBRIDGE ACROSS HUNG HOM ROAD
CONNECTING TO BAUHINIA MANSIONS OF WHAMPOA GARDEN;
TAK ON STREET, AND SECTIONS OF TAK FUNG STREET,
TAK TING STREET AND SHUNG KING STREET**

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 16 May 2016 (the 'Order'), authorized:-

- (I) (a) the permanent closure of part of the footpath widths of the section of Tak Ting Street between a point about 10 metres northeast of its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 25 metres northeast of the junction, as delineated and shown in brown on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6; and
- (b) the permanent closure of part of the carriageway and footpath widths of the section of Shung King Street between its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 10 metres northeast of the junction, as delineated and shown in orange on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6,
- with effect from 1 June 2016;
- (II) the temporary closure of the staircase of the footbridge across Hung Hom Road connecting to Bauhinia Mansions of Whampoa Garden, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6 during the period from 1 June to 31 October 2016; and
- (III) (a) the temporary partial closure of Tak On Street as delineated and shown in purple on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6; and
- (b) the temporary partial closure of the section of Tak Fung Street between its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 80 metres southwest of the junction, the section of Tak Ting Street between its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 80 metres northeast of the junction, and sections of Shung King Street between Tak Hong Street and Tak On Street, and between Tak On Street and Tak Fung Street, as delineated and shown in blue, pink and red respectively on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6,

during the period from 1 June to 31 December 2016,

for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Kwun Tong Line Extension. A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the roads and the staircase to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

A copy of this notice will be affixed on or near the roads and the staircase affected by the Order on 20 May 2016.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong so as to reach the Secretary before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the roads and the staircase or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the roads and the staircase affected by the Order.

Notice is hereby given that further closure of the same part or parts of the staircase and the roads or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure will be published if and when such an order is made.

(a) Part of the footpath widths of the section of Tak Ting Street between a point about 10 metres northeast of its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 25 metres northeast of the junction, as delineated and shown in brown on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6.	Part of the footpath widths will be permanently closed for the provision of the ventilation shaft of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.
(b) Part of the carriageway and footpath widths of the section of Shung King Street between its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 10 metres northeast of the junction, as delineated and shown in orange on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6.	Part of the carriageway and footpath widths will be permanently closed for the provision of the ventilation shaft and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.
(c) The staircase of the footbridge across Hung Hom Road connecting to Bauhinia Mansions of Whampoa Garden, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6.	The staircase will be temporarily closed and modified to facilitate the construction of the railway station entrance and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.
(d) Tak On Street, as delineated and shown in purple on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6.	Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel, railway station and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension, and reinstatement works.
(e) The section of Tak Fung Street between its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 80 metres southwest of the junction, the section of Tak Ting Street between its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 80 metres northeast of the junction, and sections of Shung King Street between Tak Hong Street and Tak On Street, and between Tak On Street and Tak Fung Street, as delineated and shown in blue, pink and red respectively on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/6.	Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel, railway station and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension, and reinstatement works.
