# NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF MAN SIU STREET AND SECTIONS OF HUNG HOM ROAD, TAK MAN STREET, MAN TAI STREET AND WAN HOI STREET

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 12 May 2014 (the 'Order'), authorized:-

- (I) the temporary closure of Man Siu Street, as delineated and shown in green on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0001/3; and
- (II) the temporary partial closure of the section of Hung Hom Road between Tak Hong Street and Tak Fung Street, the section of Tak Man Street between its junction with Hung Hom Road and a point about 170 metres northwest of the junction, the section of Man Tai Street at its junction with Man Siu Street, and the section of Wan Hoi Street between its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 50 metres northeast of the junction, as delineated and shown in blue, purple, red and yellow respectively on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0001/3,

during the period from 27 May 2014 to 26 May 2015 for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Kwun Tong Line Extension. A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the roads to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong so as to reach the Secretary before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the roads or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the roads affected by the Order.

Notice is hereby given that further closure of the same part or parts of the roads or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure will be published if and when such an order is made.

#### SCHEDULE

The roads to be affected

(a) Man Siu Street, as delineated and shown in green on the Plan.

- (b) The section of Hung Hom Road between Tak Hong Street and Tak Fung Street, the section of Tak Man Street between its junction with Hung Hom Road and a point about 170 metres northwest of the junction, and the section of Man Tai Street at its junction with Man Siu Street, as delineated and shown in blue, purple and red respectively on the Plan.
- (c) The section of Wan Hoi Street between its junction with Tak On Street and a point about 50 metres northeast of the junction, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan.

Description of the works and the manner in which the roads will be affected

The carriageways and parts of the footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the modification of the existing footbridge and staircase, the construction of the emergency accesses, ventilation shaft, temporary construction shaft, entrance of the railway station at Whampoa and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.

Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel, station entrances, railway station at Whampoa and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.

Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the emergency access and emergency escape access, ventilation shaft, railway tunnel and railway station at Whampoa, and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.

#### **Statement on Personal Data**

Any information, including the personal data, submitted to the Secretary for Transport and Housing in connection with any written claims as required under section 34 of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) will be used for the processing of the claims and other related purposes. The provision of the information, including the personal data, as required under section 34 of the Railways Ordinance is obligatory. If such information, including the personal data, as required under section 34 of the Railways Ordinance is not provided as requested, the claims may be rejected.
