KWUN TONG LINE EXTENSION  
NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING  
TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF A FOOTBRIDGE ACROSS HUNG HOM ROAD  
CONNECTING TO BAUHINIA MANSIONS OF WHAMPOA GARDEN; AND  
SECTIONS OF TAK FUNG STREET, TAK HONG STREET, TAK ON STREET, TAK  
TING STREET AND SHUNG KING STREET

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 25 August 2011 (the 'Order'), authorized:—

- (I) the temporary closure of a footbridge across Hung Hom Road connecting to Bauhinia Mansions of Whampoa Garden, as delineated and shown in yellow on Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/1;
- (II) the temporary partial closure of sections of Tak Fung Street; and sections of Tak Hong Street, as delineated and shown in blue and green respectively on Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/1; and
- (III) the temporary partial closure of sections of Tak On Street, sections of Tak Ting Street, and sections of Shung King Street between its junction with Tak Hong Street and a point about 45 metres southwest of its junction with Tak Fung Street, as delineated and shown in purple, pink and red respectively on Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/1,

during the period from 18 September 2011 to 17 September 2012 for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Kwun Tong Line Extension. A description of the works to be carried out and the footbridge and the sections of the roads to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

A copy of the Order and the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/1 (the 'Plan') may be inspected by the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:—

A copy of this notice will be affixed on or near the footbridge and roads affected by the Order on 2 September 2011.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of footbridge and roads or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the footbridge and roads affected by the Order. Such a written claim should reach the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 15th Floor, Murray Building, Garden Road, Hong Kong on or before 31 December 2011; or the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Admiralty, Hong Kong on or after 1 January 2012.

Notice is hereby given that further closure of the same part or parts of the footbridge and roads or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure will be published if and when such an order is made.

### SCHEDULE

#### *The footbridge and roads to be affected*

- (a) A footbridge across Hung Hom Road connecting to Bauhinia Mansions of Whampoa Garden, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/1.
- (b) Sections of Tak Fung Street; and sections of Tak Hong Street, as delineated and shown in blue and green respectively on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/1.
- (c) Sections of Tak On Street; sections of Tak Ting Street; and sections of Shung King Street between its junction with Tak Hong Street and a point about 45 metres southwest of its junction with Tak Fung Street, as delineated and shown in purple, pink and red respectively on the Plan numbered KTE/G04/0004/1.

#### *Description of the works and the manner in which the footbridge and the roads will be affected*

The footbridge will be temporarily closed and the staircase will be modified in connection with the construction of the station entrance of the railway station at Whampoa and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.

Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed in connection with the construction of the railway tunnel, railway station at Whampoa and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.

Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed for the construction of the railway station at Whampoa, railway tunnel and the associated railway facilities of the Kwun Tong Line Extension.

#### **Statement on Personal Data**

Any information, including the personal data, submitted to the Secretary for Transport and Housing in connection with any written claims as required under section 34 of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) will be used for the processing of the claims and other related purposes. The provision of the information, including the personal data, as required under section 34 of the Railways Ordinance is obligatory. If such information, including the personal data, as required under section 34 of the Railways Ordinance is not provided as requested, the claims may be rejected. Any information, including the personal data, so submitted may be disclosed to the relevant government departments and other organizations or agencies which are required to handle the claims and related matters.
