NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF SECTIONS OF WAN WAH STREET AND YUK WAH STREET

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 20 April 2017 (the 'Order'), authorized:—

- (I) the temporary closure of the section of Wan Wah Street between its junction with Sheung Fung Street and a point about 15 metres south of the junction, as delineated and shown in pink on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0009/9, with details as follows:
 - during the period from 11 May to 31 July 2017, with all carriageway and parts of the footpath widths of the section of the road temporarily closed;
 and
 - (b) during the period from 1 August to 30 September 2017, with parts of the carriageway and footpath widths of the section of the road temporarily closed; and
- (II) the temporary partial closure of the section of Yuk Wah Street between its junction with Wan Wah Street and a point about 170 metres east of the junction, as delineated and shown in beige on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0009/9 during the period from 11 May to 30 September 2017,

for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Shatin to Central Link. A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the roads to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong so as to reach the Secretary before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the roads or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the roads affected by the Order.

Notice is hereby given that further closure of the same part or parts of the roads or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure will be published if and when such an order is made.

SCHEDULE

The roads to be affected

Description of the works and the manner in which the roads will be affected

(a) The section of Wan Wah Street between its junction with Sheung Fung Street and a point about 15 metres south of the junction, as delineated and shown in pink on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0009/9.

During the period from 11 May to 31 July 2017, all carriageway and parts of the footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the pedestrian walkway system in relation to the Shatin to Central Link.

During the period from 1 August to 30 September 2017, parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the pedestrian walkway system in relation to the Shatin to Central Link, and reinstatement works.

(b) The section of Yuk Wah Street between its junction with Wan Wah Street and a point about 170 metres east of the junction, as delineated and shown in beige on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0009/9.

Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the pedestrian walkway system in relation to the Shatin to Central Link, and reinstatement works.
