NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING PERMANENT CLOSURE OF SECTIONS OF KIANG SU STREET; AND TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF A SECTION OF KIANG SU STREET

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 25 September 2019 (the 'Order'), authorized:-

- (I) the permanent closure of part of the carriageway widths of the section of Kiang Su Street between a point about 2 metres west of its junction with Ma Tau Wai Road and a point about 10 metres west of the junction, and part of the carriageway widths of the section of Kiang Su Street between a point about 15 metres west of its junction with Ma Tau Wai Road and a point about 35 metres west of the junction, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SCL/G24/0055/7 with effect from 31 October 2019; and
- (II) the temporary closure of the section of Kiang Su Street between Ma Tau Wai Road and Maidstone Road, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered SCL/G24/0055/7 during the period from 31 October to 30 December 2019,

for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Shatin to Central Link. A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the road to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing so as to reach the Secretary for Transport and Housing before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the road or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the road affected by the Order. (a) Part of the carriageway widths of the section of Kiang Su Street between a point about 2 metres west of its junction with Ma Tau Wai Road and a point about 10 metres west of the junction, and part of the carriageway widths of the section of Kiang Su Street between a point about 15 metres west of its junction with Ma Tau Wai Road and a point about 35 metres west of the junction, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SCL/G24/0055/7. (b) The section of Kiang Su Street between Ma Tau Wai Road and Maidstone Road, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered SCL/G24/0055/7. All carriageway and parts of the footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the reinstatement works.
