NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING PERMANENT CLOSURE OF PARTS OF THE FOOTPATH NEAR TAI WONG YE TEMPLE AT WONG CHUK HANG, AND A FOOTPATH AND STAIRCASE NEAR HOLY SPIRIT SEMINARY; AND TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF A SECTION OF THE FOOTPATH NEAR TAI WONG YE TEMPLE AT WONG CHUK HANG

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 27 May 2016 (the 'Order'), authorized:—

- (A) (I) the permanent closure of parts of the footpath near Tai Wong Ye Temple at the points about 5 metres, 50 metres and 90 metres west of its junction with the western end of Tai Wong Ye Temple, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SILE/G09/0006/5; and
 - (II) the permanent closure of the footpath and staircase connecting Holy Spirit Seminary to the southern side of Wong Chuk Hang Nullah, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SILE/G10/0006/5,

with effect from 24 June 2016; and

(B) the temporary closure of the section of the footpath near Tai Wong Ye Temple between its junction with the western end of Tai Wong Ye Temple and a point about 90 metres west of the junction, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered SILE/G09/0006/5 during the period from 24 June to 31 December 2016.

for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the South Island Line (East). A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the footpaths and the staircase to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong so as to reach the Secretary before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the footpaths and the staircase or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the footpaths and the staircase affected by the Order.

Notice is hereby given that further closure of the same part or parts of the footpath or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure will be published if and when such an order is made.

The footpaths and the staircase to be affected

Description of the works and the manner in which the footpaths and the staircase will be affected

(a) Parts of the footpath near Tai Wong Ye Temple at the points about 5 metres, 50 metres and 90 metres west of its junction with the western end of Tai Wong Ye Temple, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SILE/G09/0006/5.

Parts of the footpath widths will be permanently closed for the provision of the railway viaduct of the South Island Line (East). The footpaths and the staircase to be affected

Description of the works and the manner in which the footpaths and the staircase will be affected

- (b) The footpath and staircase connecting Holy Spirit Seminary to the southern side of Wong Chuk Hang Nullah, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SILE/G10/0006/5.
- The footpath and staircase will be permanently closed for the provision of the railway viaduct and the associated railway facilities of the South Island Line (East).
- (c) The section of the footpath near Tai Wong Ye Temple between its junction with the western end of Tai Wong Ye Temple and a point about 90 metres west of the junction, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered SII.E/G09/0006/5

The footpath will be temporarily closed for the modification of parts of Wong Chuk Hang Nullah to facilitate the construction of the railway viaduct and the associated railway facilities of the South Island Line (East), and reinstatement works
