Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Logistics has, by order made on 10 May 2023 (the 'Order'), authorized the temporary closure of the section of the unnamed road between Sui Yat House and Fuk Yat House of Yat Tung Estate, Tung Chung, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plans numbered TCLE/G01/0002/1 and TCLE/G02/0002/1 during the period from 3 June 2023 to 2 June 2024 for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Tung Chung Line Extension. A description of the works to be carried out, the section of the road to be affected and the manner in which it will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Logistics so as to reach the Secretary for Transport and Logistics before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the road or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the road affected by the Order.
