

**RAILWAYS ORDINANCE (Chapter 519)
(Notice under section 23)**

SHATIN TO CENTRAL LINK

**NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING
TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF
SECTIONS OF YUK WAH STREET AND YUK WAH CRESCENT**

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 15 April 2015 (the ‘Order’), authorized:–

- (I) the temporary closure of the section of Yuk Wah Street between its junction with Tsz Wan Shan Road and a point about 50 metres west of the junction, as delineated and shown in purple on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0007/4, with details as follows :
 - (a) from 1.30 a.m. to 5.30 a.m. during the periods of (i) 1 July to 31 August 2015; and (ii) 11 September to 30 November 2015, with all carriageways and footpaths widths of the section of the road closed; and
 - (b) from 1 May to 20 December 2015, except the periods specified in (I)(a) above, with parts of the carriageway and footpath widths of the section of the road closed; and

- (II) the temporary partial closure of the section of Yuk Wah Street between a point about 50 metres west of its junction with Tsz Wan Shan Road and a point about 280 metres west of the junction, and the section of Yuk Wah Crescent (near Manning Theatre Building) between its junction with Yuk Wah Street and a point about 14 metres south of the junction, as delineated and shown in green and yellow respectively on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0007/4 during the period from 1 May to 20 December 2015,

for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Shatin to Central Link. A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the roads to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

A copy of the Order and the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0007/4 (the ‘Plan’) may be inspected by the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:–

A copy of this notice will be affixed on or near the roads affected by the Order on 24 April 2015.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong so as to reach the Secretary before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the roads or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the roads affected by the Order.

Notice is hereby given that further closure of the same part or parts of the roads or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure will be published if and when such an order is made.

(b) The section of Yuk Wah Street between a point about 50 metres west of its junction with Tsz Wan Shan Road and a point about 280 metres west of the junction, and the section of Yuk Wah Crescent (near Manning Theatre Building) between its junction with Yuk Wah Street and a point about 14 metres south of the junction, as delineated and shown in green and yellow respectively on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0007/4.
