NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING
TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF SECTIONS OF YUK WAH STREET,
YUK WAH CRESCENT, FUNG TAK ROAD, LUNG POON STREET,
WONG TAI SIN ROAD, SHATIN PASS ROAD, YING FUNG LANE, AND
THE ACCESS ROAD CONNECTING WONG TAI SIN ROAD AND
SIK SIK YUEN WONG TAI SIN TEMPLE; AND
TEMPORARY ALTERATION OF A STAIRCASE AND FOOTPATH
NEAR THE JUNCTION OF SHATIN PASS ROAD AND FUNG TAK ROAD

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 20 November 2015 (the 'Order'), authorized:—

- (I) the temporary partial closure of the section of Yuk Wah Street between its junction with Tsz Wan Shan Road and a point about 280 metres west of the junction, and the section of Yuk Wah Crescent (near Manning Theatre Building) between its junction with Yuk Wah Street and a point about 14 metres south of the junction, as delineated and shown in green and yellow respectively on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0007/5;
- (II) the temporary partial closure of the section of Fung Tak Road between a point about 50 metres southeast of its junction with Lung Poon Street and a point about 50 metres northwest of the junction, and the section of Lung Poon Street between its junction with Fung Tak Road and a point about 140 metres southwest of the junction, as delineated and shown in pink and blue respectively on the Plan numbered SCL/G09/0007/3;
- (III) the temporary partial closure of the section of Wong Tai Sin Road between Ma Chai Hang Road and Shatin Pass Road, the section of Shatin Pass Road between a point about 65 metres north of its junction with Fung Tak Road and a point about 50 metres southwest of the junction, the section of Ying Fung Lane between its junction with Fung Tak Road and a point about 20 metres south of the junction, and the section of Fung Tak Road between its junction with Shatin Pass Road and a point about 50 metres east of the junction, as delineated and shown in green, blue, brown and yellow respectively on the Plan numbered SCL/G08/0008/4;
- (IV) the temporary partial closure of the section of the access road connecting Wong Tai Sin Road and Sik Sik Yuen Wong Tai Sin Temple between its junction with Wong Tai Sin Road and a point about 40 metres southwest of

the junction, as delineated and shown in pink on the Plan numbered SCL/G08/0008/4; and

(V) the temporary alteration of the staircase and footpath near the junction of Shatin Pass Road and Fung Tak Road, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SCL/G08/0008/4,

during the period from 21 December 2015 to 20 December 2016 for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Shatin to Central Link. A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the roads, the staircase and the footpath to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong so as to reach the Secretary before the expiration of one year from the closure/alteration of

the relevant part or parts of the roads, the staircase and the footpath or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the roads, the staircase and the footpath affected by the Order.

Notice is hereby given that further closure/alteration of the same part or parts of the roads, the staircase and the footpath or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure/alteration will be published if and when such an order is made.

SCHEDULE

The roads, the staircase and the footpath to be affected

Description of the works and the manner in which the roads, the staircase and the footpath will be affected

(a) The section of Yuk Wah Street between its junction with Tsz Wan Shan Road and a point about 280 metres west of the junction, and the section of Yuk Wah Crescent (near Manning Theatre Building) between its junction with Yuk Wah Street and a point about 14 metres south of the junction, as delineated and shown in green and yellow respectively on the Plan numbered SCL/G10/0007/5. Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the pedestrian walkway system at Yuk Wah Street in relation to the Shatin to Central Link

(b) The section of Fung Tak Road between a point about 50 metres southeast of its junction with Lung Poon Street and a point about 50 metres northwest of the junction, and the section of Lung Poon Street between its junction with Fung Tak Road and a point about 140 metres southwest of the junction, as delineated and shown in pink and blue respectively on the Plan numbered SCL/G09/0007/3. Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the pedestrian walkway system at Fung Tak Road in relation to the Shatin to Central Link

The roads, the staircase and the footpath to be affected

Description of the works and the manner in which the roads, the staircase and the footpath will be affected

(c) The section of Wong Tai Sin Road between Ma Chai Hang Road and Shatin Pass Road, the section of Shatin Pass Road between a point about 65 metres north of its junction with Fung Tak Road and a point about 50 metres southwest of the junction, the section of Ying Fung Lane between its junction with Fung Tak Road and a point about 20 metres south of the junction, and the section of Fung Tak Road between its junction with Shatin Pass Road and a point about 50 metres east of the junction, as delineated and shown in green, blue, brown and vellow respectively on the Plan numbered SCL/G08/0008/4

Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel and the associated railway facilities of the Shatin to Central Link.

(d) The section of the access road connecting Wong Tai Sin Road and Sik Sik Yuen Wong Tai Sin Temple between its junction with Wong Tai Sin Road and a point about 40 metres southwest of the junction, as delineated and shown in pink on the Plan numbered SCL/G08/0008/4. Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel and the associated railway facilities of the Shatin to Central Link.

(e) The staircase and footpath near the junction of Shatin Pass Road and Fung Tak Road, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SCL/G08/0008/4 The staircase and footpath will be temporarily altered with a shift in alignment in close proximity to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel and the associated railway facilities of the Shatin to Central Link.
