

## **RAILWAYS ORDINANCE (Chapter 519)**

### **(Notice under Section 6(4))**

#### **TUEN MUN SOUTH EXTENSION**

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary for Transport and Housing proposes to construct the Tuen Mun South Extension as described in the scheme and shown on General Layout Plans Nos. TMSE-G01 to TMSE-G08 inclusive; and Control of Building Plans and Commencement of Work Plan No. TMSE-P01 (the 'Plans') annexed thereto. The scheme and the Plans have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature and effects of the scheme are as follows:

The proposed Tuen Mun South Extension comprises an extension of existing Tuen Ma Line from Tuen Mun Station to Tuen Mun South near Tuen Mun Ferry Terminal for the provision of domestic passenger service. It provides an approximately 2.4 kilometres long electrified double-track railway system with two proposed railway stations at Tuen Mun Area 16 and near Tuen Mun Ferry Terminal respectively. The proposed Tuen Mun South Extension includes the following works:

- (a) construction of
  - (i) the above ground railway station and railway facilities at Tuen Mun Area 16, the associated station entrances and plant rooms;
  - (ii) the elevated railway station and railway facilities near Tuen Mun Ferry Terminal, the associated station entrances and plant rooms;
  - (iii) an approximately 1.0 kilometre long railway viaduct connecting the existing Tuen Mun Station and the proposed railway station at Tuen Mun Area 16;
  - (iv) an approximately 1.0 kilometre long railway viaduct including the railway bridge across the Tuen Mun River Channel connecting the proposed railway station at Tuen Mun Area 16 and the proposed railway station near Tuen Mun Ferry Terminal;
  - (v) an emergency access point near the Tuen Mun Park Children's Playground; and
  - (vi) an emergency vehicular access and plant buildings near the proposed railway station at Tuen Mun Area 16;

- (b) modification of the existing overrun facility at Tuen Mun Station to facilitate future operation;
- (c) railway track formation works, earthworks, civil and structural works, electrical and mechanical works;
- (d) construction of other associated railway facilities including trackwork, train control and communication facilities and electrical and mechanical plants;
- (e) construction of a vehicle pick-up and drop-off area at Wu King Road Garden;
- (f) construction of a road connecting Hoi Wong Road near Hoi Chu Road and the proposed railway station at Tuen Mun Area 16;
- (g) construction of two temporary bridges across Tuen Mun River Channel as temporary construction accesses;
- (h) construction of temporary barge loading facilities at Wu Shan Road;
- (i) associated reconstruction, modification and realignment of existing roads and facilities including carriageways, footpaths, footbridges, subways, retaining walls, staircases, parks, open spaces, cycle tracks, bicycle parking spaces, bus lay-bys and bus shelters;
- (j) preventive or remedial works including ground treatment; and
- (k) ancillary works including associated drainage works, waterworks, slope works, landscaping works, other road works, demolition and reprovisioning of existing services and facilities, and demolition of abandoned foundations and facilities.

The scheme and the Plans are available for inspection by members of the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:

Any information, including the personal data, so submitted may be disclosed to the relevant government departments, railway corporations, and other persons, organizations or agencies which are required to handle the objections/comments and related matters. Persons who have so submitted their personal data have the rights to request access to and correction of their personal data held by us.
